GIFTS & EXCHANGE: Japan-India Relations

- Buddhism was introduced to Japan from India (7th-8th centuries)
- India-Japan established official relations in 1952
- 1952: PM Nehru waived all post-war reparations claims against Japan
- India became the first nation in the world to receive an ODA Loan from Japan
 - (Perhaps Japan has been paying reparations ever since)
- TODAY: Japan is the largest donor of ODA to India




Japan, India & Development Aid

- Development Aid: Key element of Japan's diplomatic toolkit
- WHY?
 - 1947: Japan renounced its "right to wage warfare" and was prohibited from maintaining offensive military.

Aid as an "imperial formation"

- But have these development agendas always served the needs of all Indians? Or of which Indians?
- "Imperial formations" often use displacement and appropriation to create new subjects
- Such new subjects may be "dispossessed to be modern" and "stripped of old cultural bearings" to be humanized (Stoler & McGranahan 2007)







"Tokyo Declaration for Japan-India Special Strategic & Global Partnership" (2014)

- India-Japan bilateral summit annually
- PM Modi and PM Abe agreed
 - 1) To double Japan's direct foreign investment in India within 5 years
 - 2) To double the number of Japanese companies in India within 5 years
 - 3) Committed to 2 trillion Rupees (3.5 trillion JPY) of public and private Japanese investment and financing in India (including ODA) by 2019

ODA Master Charter Revision (2015)

- PM Abe's "Three Arrows" Economic Revitalization Plan
 - Aid to be mobilized as a strategy for corporate growth
 - Focus on "public-private partnerships"

- Shifted from strictly need-based aid to "proactive pacifism"
 - But how can ODA's policies honor Japan's "pacifist stance" when promoting military equipment sales to India?

 Soft loans = Accumulated total of 3 lakh crore (JPY 4.9 trillion) by FY 2016/2017

- Transport 62%
- Energy 14%
- Water 12%
- Agriculture & Forestry 6%
- Other 6%

"Environmental conservation is also a task for all humankind, which all countries, developed and developing alike, must work together to tackle" - ODA Charter, 1999




Figure 5. The Share of Each Group Among the Sum of Bilateral Energy Official Development Assistance Loans for the Past 10 Years









"Tied Aid" = Linking aid packages to profits for the lending nations' corporations

- Under OECD rules, "tied aid" is prohibited
 - Certain aid recipient nations explicitly prohibit "tied aid" (e.g. Bangladesh, other Heavily Indebted Poor Countries (HIPCs)
- Increases loan debt by 15-30%
- Issue of dependency on the lending nation
 - Japan can urge that Japanese firms be selected
 - SHIFT: From "Need-based" to marketed aid
 - 2014 Japanese Federation of Businesses (Keidanren) Report
 - 2015 ODA Charter revised
- Critics: "Economic growth will not solve poverty"





- Otal loan amount of 1,391 billion Japanese Yen, equivalent to Rs. 73,000 crore, (as of January 31, 2016) has been committed for development of transport infrastructure in India.
- There are 12 Loan & Technical Cooperation projects under execution in various parts of India as below.



Japan has introduced

- 1) "Safety culture"
- 2) Technical standards
- 3) Capacity building for NHSRCL (National High Speed Rail Corporation Limited)







"Bullet Train": Mumbai-Ahmedabad High-Speed Rail

"Although the total cost of constructing the high-speed rail will be 40% more expensive than having a Chinese company build it, we considered the diverse benefits of Indo-Japan relations and chose Japan's Shinkansen." -Indian Official to Nihon Keizai Newspaper, Dec. 2015

- A) ODA loan of JPY 100 billion
- B) Support for "Make in India" through tech transfer from Japan

- "Bullet train exacerbates gap between rich and poor & increases debt burden"
 - Fares at 3000Rs economy seats (Mumbai-Ahmedabad) vs. 200 Rs for present Ind. Railways route
- Yen loans should finance repair/maintenance on current railways
- Bullet train soothes Japan's national pride after row with China on Indonesian bullet train
 - Loan interest rate of 0.1% (over 50 years)
 - Japan will provide 80% of budget (Rs 88,000 crore out of Rs 1.08 lakh crore)



"Securitized Aid"

- Caveat: "Japan will avoid any use of development cooperation for military purposes or for aggravation of international conflicts. In case the armed forces or members of the armed forces in recipient countries are involved in development cooperation for non-military purposes such as public welfare or disaster-relief purposes, such cases will be considered on a case-by-case basis."
 - Article B(b), Revised ODA Charter, February 2015







Toward a Conclusion

- "PPPs" (Public-Private Partnerships) Boon or Bane?
- Development Aid as type of "imperial formation"
 - Promotes vision of granting nation as technologically-advanced and morally virtuous
 - Neither colonial settlement nor state administration needed
 - Culture of moral order through legal structures, infrastructure, and extension of Japan Inc. into Indian soil
