Australian experience



1852 University of Sydney (first university)

1881 Women students admitted (equal basis to men)

1921 First woman lecturer in mathematics (Margaret Barr Moir, University of Western Australia)

1964 First woman Professor of Mathematics (Hanna Neumann, Australian National University)



Australian experience



1983 CEP Second woman maths professor in Australia - University of Western Australia

1992 CEP First woman president Australian Mathematical Society ... next woman to be president was Nalini Joshi in 2008!

2006 onwards: annual get-togethers of women participants at annual AustMS meetings

International experience



International Congresses of Mathematicians (ICM) and IMU

1897 First ICM - Zurich **4 women participants out of 208 No women speakers**

1900 Paris ICM

David Hilbert (Gottingen, Germany) famous lecture: list of 23 math problems for the new century shaped direction math research

1951 International Mathematical Union (IMU) established



International experience



1932 ICM – again in Zurich Emmy Noether first woman to give a plenary lecture at an ICM

58 years later: 1990 ICM in Kyoto Karen Uhlenbeck second woman ICM plenary speaker

Problem: visibility/participation by women





Women in Math. Assoc'ns Before the 1990 ICM

1971 Association for Women in Mathematics AWM (in the US) – with men and women as members

1980 AWM initiated: **Emmy Noether Lecture** Annually at Joint Mathematics meeting of AMS

1994 Organised by AWM – **"Additional Emmy Noether lecture**" presented at ICM [each four years]

"to honour women who have made fundamental and sustained contributions to the mathematical sciences"

Women in Math. Assoc'ns After the 1990 ICM

2002: General Assembly of International Mathematical Union

- formalize the ICM Emmy Noether Lecture
- given in ICMs in 2006 and 2010
- Then reviewed

2010: General Assembly of International Mathematical Union

- established the ICM Emmy Noether Lecture
- On-going held each ICM

Women and the IMU IMU established 1951



• IMU Executive Committee (IMU EC) of 11 persons

- President, 2 Vice-Presidents, Secretary General
- 6 Members-at-Large
- Immediate past President
- Elected at IMU General Assembly for a 4 year term
 - IMU GA held just before an ICM
- 2002 First IMU GA where a woman elected to IMU EC

2003-2006 First term with a woman on the IMU EC

- Chaired 1st ICM Emmy Noether Lecture Committee
